The CYHA Board of Directors is happy to announce the Charleston Wolverines coaching staffs for the 2010-2011 season. We thank all coaches for their interest in our Association teams and look forward to a great season! Coaches are as follows:

Squirt-

Bryson Busniuk- From Thunder Bay, Ontario. Played Junior A hockey in USHL, four years at D1 Vermont University followed by a 6 year minor pro career. The former Stingray has coached and taught hockey schools for over 11 years.

Terry Conlin- From Sault St. Marie, Ontario. Played Junior hockey in Southern Ontario. He was the head coach of the Kemptville College men's varsity hockey club. He was also the head instructor for the Ottawa Senators Minor Hockey Developmental Program for three years.

Peewee-

Matt Reid- From Massena, NY. Played youth hockey in up-state New York finishing his senior year at Northwood's Academy in Lake Placid. Matt went on to play three years at Clarkson University D1 followed by a 9 year minor pro career. Matt has over 15 years of experience teaching at various hockey schools and developmental camps. All the flooring from the main entrance double doors to the locker room doors is being replaced. While the floor replacement is happening, the Ice Palace will also have the Palace Rink closed to replace the boards and redo the ice surface. Bauer Youth & Jr. Hockey Sticks Recalled ...

MISSISSAUGA, Ontario - Bauer Hockey Corp. has issued a recall of 13 different youth and junior hockey sticks due to possible high levels of lead. The sticks are under the Nike Bauer brand name.

Health Canada randomly tested the Nike Bauer Supreme One50 composite stick and found excessive levels of lead in the yellow paint on the stick. Bauer tested all 120 models of its hockey sticks manufactured since 2004. Of those tested, 12 exceeded the allowable lead limit.

Health Canada has not received any reports of incidents or illnesses related to the use of the hockey sticks.

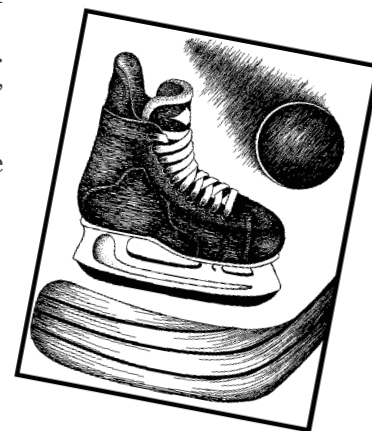
The recall covers almost all the junior sticks manufactured by the Ontario, Canada-based hockey gear company since 2004. The sticks were made at factory in China.

Bauer has issued a stop sale notice to retailers in North America asking them to remove 13 sticks from their shelves.
